The mission of the Board of Certified Public Accountants is to regulate the practice of public accounting by CPAs in the public's interest, to qualify applicants to take the Uniform CPA examination and insure the appropriate exam is provided, to issue CPA certificates and permits, and to enforce provisions of CPA Act and Rules and Regulations within a constantly changing environment. By ensuring the highest standards are imposed, the Board assists the public through a means of assuring that services are provided by competent individuals and firms.

Major accomplishments and efficiencies

- ◆ Drafted and filed amendments to eight (8) chapters of the agency's regulations.
- ◆ Acted as liaison with other national representatives to insure statutes and regulations are comparable to national standards.
- ◆ Conducted numerous investigations as a result of complaints filed, involved in monitoring national current events in the accounting industry. Held one week long administrative hearing.
- ◆ Made significant progress towards the development of an on-line renewal system; drafted and introduced legislation to amend the current law; continue to work on new legislation which we hope to pass in 2005.
- ◆ Published two informational newsletters.
